Integrity gives Winters the edge in District 1

Voters in Surprise City Council District 1 will choose between two candidates who differ little on the issues or their qualifications. With so few policy differences, something more subjective should lead district residents to Roland Winters.

Winters moved to Surprise five years ago after a corporate career in California, where he also owned a photo studio. He's running against Ted Cimino, a 10-year resident who is retired from a career in New York City government.

Both list creating jobs as the city's top priority. Both say they would do this by marketing Surprise more aggressively, although Winters also would push for streamlining city-planning processes and lowering impact fees.

Both want to improve parks. Cimino says this could be funded by selling naming rights, an idea that ought to raise red flags with residents.

Winters emphasizes District 1 issues, such as worries about target shooting in the far-west reaches of the area and the need for a grocery and nice restaurant. There's not much a City Council member can do about the latter two.

Both have been actively involved in the community, Cimino as a Neighborhood Watch leader and Winters, who

uses a wheelchair, as an advocate for the disabled.

As we say, not much to differentiate the two, although Winters' attention to District 1 concerns gives him a slight ad-

It widens considerably on the issue of integrity. Early in the campaign, Cimino told voters he had been a city manager in New York. That would indicate he held the top staff job in the nation's largest city. That would be an impressive credential indeed.

Cimino held no such job. He was director of administrative services, managing office staff. He now refers to his "city management experience," and explains that in the East "city manager" is the term for positions such as this.

That's weak. He's been involved in Surprise city affairs for a decade. He knows what the term means here. His description of himself as a city manager reeks of trying to inflate his qualifications for office.

If he'll mislead voters about his resume can they trust him to be forthright in office?

That's a chance they shouldn't take, particularly when not much else separates the two candidates. We recommend Roland Winters for District 1.
