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Member Travel Notes - Will

Hello all,

I hope everyone had a wonderful holiday season and I wish you a great 2018.

I would like to encourage members to feel free to send travel stories/articles to the editor to be included in the HTC newsletter. Stories about campgrounds, your accessible RV or trailer, accessibility adaptions, mini-rallies, travel experiences: current or historical would make for fine articles. Shine a light on opportunities to see and experience our world. Certainly many members have valuable experience to share. So with this thought in mind, here is an article on our most recent travels.

Since the Kerrville Texas rally in October we along with Jack and Joan Lindhorst rolled south about three-hundred and fifty miles to Port Isabel and over the Queen Isabella Causeway to spend two months with snow birding "Winter Texans" at Isla Blanca County Park in the city of South Padre Island. South Padre Island is located on Padre Island on the Gulf of Mexico, and at 113 miles long is the longest barrier island in the world. Being a barrier island the land is flat and sandy with palm trees blowing in the breeze. We arrived in early November to blue skies and temperatures in the 70s and 80s.

Isla Blanca County Park is at the south tip of the island with scenic views of the bordering waters of the Gulf of Mexico, Laguna Madre, and the Brazos Santiago Pass connecting the laguna with the gulf. Isla Blanca is a large RV park with more than six hundred RV sites amongst green grass and palms. Our full hookup site was level with a cement picnic area. Walk a hundred yards or so and you are looking at water. We rolled on the sidewalks along the sandy beach taking in views of the beach, kite boarders, shore birds, and tourists wading into the ocean. Along the Brazos Santiago Pass we had lunch at the picnic tables; there accessible paths and a road provided views of fishing boats heading to and from the gulf.

An accessible public boardwalk fishing pier on the Padre Island side of the causeway was a great platform for casting a line into the Laguna Madre's blue green waters while watching pelicans, gulls, and osprey fly over the lagoon. We caught and released two catfish and several small perch. There is also a pier at Pirates Landing on the Port Isabel side of the causeway where you can fish for a fee. Sea turtles nest on Padre Island, and one afternoon we visited a turtle rehab facility known as Sea Turtle Inc where we watched Atlantic Green, Kemp's Ridley, and Loggerhead turtles swim in large tanks. Here the turtles are cared for optimistically to be released back into their natural saltwater habitat.

South Padre Island is a resort town so there were plenty of restaurants to choose from when we did dine out. We can recommend the following: Gabriella's Italian Grill and Pizzeria on South Padre Island where we enjoyed fresh bread, salad, and the pepperoni and Soprano pizzas, Los Tortugos Seafood Market in Port Isabel for great fish'n chips, and Pier 19 for breakfast, omelets and coffee with a view of Laguna Madre. If you drive to Brownsville about twenty-five miles away; Fish King has great fish tacos, fish'n chips, and seafood soup. For groceries we shopped at the HEB and Walmart across the causeway in Port Isabel, about 3 miles from the park.

Although the weather in November was mostly in the 70s and 80s, in December the temperatures dropped into the 40s to 70s influenced by an arctic cold front. Per the locals this has been a much colder Winter season. If you're looking for a warmer Winter location to camp at, Isla Blanca County Park is worth considering. Of note, the county is beginning a multi-million dollar renovation of the park which will make Isla Blanca even better in the future.
