Rememberances

Roland Frederick Winters Jr. September 20, 1942 - May 3, 2024

Roland lived an Amazing Life!

It is with great sadness we announce the passing of Roland F. Winters, Jr. Our loss is heaven's gain. Roland lived his life to the fullest and lived like it was his last day every day. He was diagnosed with Becker's Muscular Dystrophy at the age of nine.

The doctor advised Roland's parents, Doris Dupont Winters & Roland F. Winters, Sr, that he would only live until the age of eighteen. Roland proved him wrong and lived to eighty-one. The oldest of four siblings, Wayne, June, and Geraldine. Roland was born in Jersey City, NJ and the family relocated from Teaneck to Newton, NJ in 1959.

Roland graduated in 1960 from Newton High School and graduated in 1964 from German School of Photography in downtown Manhattan, NYC. He loved riding his



motorcycle and taking pictures. He worked for a local photography store in Newton and later started his own Photography Business, Winters Photos.

He shared his knowledge and love of photography with his youngest sister, Geraldine Winters and his niece, Kim Nicolais.

In 1965, Roland relocated to Whittier, CA and started a long career of thirty-two years as the Photo Lab Supervisor at Hughes Aircraft in Fullerton. During this time, he met Howard Hughes. He worked Full-Time at Hughes and had his Winters Photos Business. He worked nights and weekends taking beautiful pictures for Weddings.

Roland married Carroll Elaine York in 1970 in Las Vegas at the Little Chapel of the West. He enjoyed people and was the life of the party.

He earned an Associate Degree from Fullerton College and Bachelor of Arts Degree from California State University Fullerton.

Roland served the Handicap Community for the City of Placentia, CA. In 2008, Roland and Carroll retired to Surprise, AZ where he served as HOA board member for Arizona Traditions. Roland served as the District 1 Councilmember for the City of Surprise for nine years, working towards his goal of Surprise being a place where residents could "live, get educated, work and play." He served as Vice Mayor & Councilman for the city and in 2013-2018, voted for wage increases for the Firemen & Police, until his health had deteriorated.

Roland loved to take road trips, take pictures, and attend his Handicapped Travel Events. Roland was an inspiration to all.

Roland never stopped working and didn't complain about his disability or let it hold him back. He even went skydiving. His family looked up to him as a hardworking man.

His family will miss him dearly but is excited about joining him and the other family in our final resting place.

Roland leaves behind a loving wife of 54 Years, Carroll; four children, David (Gina), Donald (Barb), Nancy, and Jennifer; seven grandchildren: Ashley (Samuel), Kevin, Jacob (Brooklyn), Kaitlyn, Joshua, Kenneth (Eliya), and Melinda; two great-grandchildren: Zeke, and a baby due in October. Five nephews and five nieces. One nephew greeted him in heaven. His brother Wayne (Ann), San Diego, CA., sister June Nicholais, (predeceased, husband Jimmy, and son Vincent), Blairstown, NJ, and sister, Geraldine, Placentia, CA.

Roland - By Long Time Friend and HTC Member - Ed Pearson

Roland Winters was born in 1942 so he was a war baby who survived the disruptions of the war years and went on to a lifetime of activities and accomplishments. He married his truelove Carroll and raised a successful family. He was a photographer, a traveler, a politician, and a mainstay of the Handicapped Travel Club where he served several years as President and Historian. He was at times active in pursuing small businesses to make their establishments accessible to the disabled. He was also a cowboy if you noticed his boots, hat, and license plate. One of the major highlights of his career was the 10 years he served as a City Councilman in Surprise AZ, where he lived in his later years.

I first met Roland in Indio at an HTC rally in 1998 I think it was. He was not yet using a wheelchair as I recall but had a lift attached to the driver's side of his van that he could stand on and be lifted up to the driver's seat. Over the years we saw each other at HTC meetings but also shared other get togethers including an occasional dinner at his house in Surprise.

In reflecting on our past times together, two occasions stand out especially. Bonnie and I were married in Chico in December 2009 and Roland was of course invited. We were surprised that he planned to attend, but he said he had a good friend in Chico that he would visit also. Well, he did more than attend. He was our wedding photographer and presented us with an album of pictures as a wedding present. Was that special or what? I had a long talk with Roland before he passed and reminded him of that super gift. He remembered the event very well, including the fact that it rained like crazy that night and he got soaked. The album is a special possession of ours.

The other occasion that stands out for me is our 1000-mile RV caravan trip down the Baja Peninsula to Cabo San Lucas in 2007. Roland didn't have an RV but he and a close relative joined the group in his van. We spent 5 days going down and a few days in Cabo and environs. He was in a motel in Cabo and I was in an RV park a mile or so out of town. I was surprised at one point when he

knocked on the trailer door, having made a quickie trip out from town in his power chair to see how we were doing. We were on our own on the way back and planned to meet about halfway up Baja and travel together the rest of the way. Turns out we didn't connect because Roland had decided he wanted to get home quickly and drove back nonstop. Maybe his cowboy personality kicked in there. Telephone service was not available down there in those days but our caravan had kept in close touch because we all had a CB radio unit available.

Anyway, Roland was a special guy that I had a great relationship with over the years. He served us all beautifully in many ways and will be fondly remembered.
